The name, Dublin, however, comes from the Irish, [Dubh Linn](#), which translates to the "Black Pool" indicating the formation of the dark tidal pool formed behind the Dublin Castle, where River Poddle flowed into the River Liffey. Thought to be uninhabited during pre-historic times, Ptolemy's writings do suggest of early human settlements in about 140 AD, called as Eblana. It was in 841 AD that Vikings settled in the Dublin until 1169 when the Norman invasion of Ireland by Wales was launched. It was not until 1171, that King Henry II of [England](#) restated his dominion and proclaimed himself Lord of Ireland.

Basically an island city, one can reach Dublin, either by flight or by ferry. There are daily ferry and cruise trips from the UK and mainland Europe. Also known as the Island of saints and scholars, Dublin, built in centuries of history and culture offers a perfect blend of heritage and hedonism. The city is basically a perfect village capital, with friendliness & warmth at every nook & corner of the city.
