**Journal of Emergency and Trauma Care (IPJEC)** is a newly launched journal which will be dedicated to advance the science and practice of pre-hospital and hospital emergency medicine, and critical care and traumatic injuries and medication. It is directed towards physicians and medical personnel undergoing training or working within the field of Emergency Medicine and trauma care. I am pleased to announce that, all issues of volume 4 were published online well within the time and the print issues were also brought out and dispatched within 30 days of publishing the issue online during the year of 2019.

Journal mainly discuss on conceptual breakthroughs, its goal is to facilitate rapid publication and circulation of novel discoveries in the field of traumatic stress disorders and related care and medication along with different aspects of emergency and critical medicine. Journal scope encompasses the knowledge in medical research of the nervous system leading to psychological effects of trauma and also the related care and medication. Also it encompasses the scope of medical trauma, community violence, and sexual abuse and related other forms of trauma and the medication for the same. The mission of Journal of Emergency and Trauma Care is to provide readers with a broad spectrum of themes in trauma, acute trauma, traumatic stress etc.

All published articles of this journal are included in the indexing and abstracting coverage of Index Copernicus, Google Scholar, Cosmos Impact Factor, CiteFactor, Electronic Journals Library, Secret Search Engine Labs, and Directory of Research Journal Indexing (DRJI). Studies receiving funding from a funding organization that is included on the list of PMC and Research Funder Policies or authors having NIH grant were submitted to PubMed.

During the calendar year of 2019, Journal of Emergency and Trauma Care received a total of 32 manuscripts, out of which 23 articles (70%) were rejected in the preliminary screening due to plagiarism or being out of the format and peer review process.

During 2019 around 9 articles were subjected for small publication after they are accepted in the peer review process. In the 3 issues of Volume 4 published during the year 2019, a total of 9 articles were published (at an average of 2 articles per issue) of which, articles were published from authors all around the world. Globally articles have been accessed by the research scientists and also cited.

During the calendar year 2019, a total of one Editor, six Reviewers joined the board of Journal of Emergency and Trauma Care and contributed their valuable services towards contribution as well as publication of articles, and their valuable reviewer comments will be beneficial to publish quality of article in the Journal.
